Group Experience Project

The Academic Leadership Institute includes a Group Experience Project that will involve the development of small groups who will work throughout the duration of the Institute; examine a current issue in American higher education from the academic perspective; and present findings, recommendations, and opportunities for partnership toward the end of the Institute. The following overview describes the Group Experience Project opportunity and will be reviewed in more depth during orientation.

- **Pre-Established Groups:** In order to provide opportunities to network and develop presentations from diverse perspectives, groups will be established prior to orientation and will seek to connect individuals from diverse backgrounds and different institutions.
- **Group Experience Project:** The Group Experience Project was developed in response for a call from previous ALI participants to provide opportunities to network and develop stronger professional connections among ALI class members. In addition, it provides an opportunity for participants to learn from each other. The expectation is that the group will select a topic and over the course of the ALI, examine the issue and provide classmates with an overview of the topic, findings, recommendations, and opportunities for individual institutions and inter-institutional partnerships.
- **Group Experience Topics:** Sample Topics will be offered during the orientation session and groups will be provided 15 minutes to either select a sample topic or come up with their own topic. Topics cannot be duplicative.
- **Group Experience Presentations:** During the March 3, 2016 session, groups will provide a 20 minute dynamic presentation on their topic. Access to a computer and projector with PowerPoint software will be provided for the presentation.
