The event was a tremendous success with 284 registered and 380 participants attending the actual event! 90% of the attendees rated the Summit Excellent/Very Good and felt that the breakout sessions were extremely valuable. The Steering Committee will use the work of the breakout sessions to develop strategic plans for the next year and expects to host the third Summit in a year. ## WNY Student 2 Biz Challenge Hosts Regional Competition and Earns 2<sup>nd</sup> Place in NYS Business Plan Competition!

The *WNY Student 2 Biz Challenge* is a student entrepreneurship initiative with the goal of providing engaging learning opportunities and identifying and incubating high potential student businesses. Overall, 450 teams competed in 10 regional competitions across New York State. On April 18, 2013, Canisius hosted 29 teams at the WNY Regional Business Plan Competition where we selected 6 teams to attend the *statewide competition in Albany*. On April 26<sup>th</sup>, our teams competed against 88 statewide teams with our Sustainability Team from UB, *diMien LLC* taking 2<sup>nd</sup> Place (\$5000)! This year we had 11 Consortium institutions participate. Next year we hope to increase that number!

The FDG will now focus on how the Consortium can evolve the role faculty development and career services professionals play in positively influencing stronger student learning outcomes. The goal is to develop a multi-year effort and to use the event as a catalyst for a significant event in the fall 2013 or spring 2014.

#### Strategic Initiatives of the Consortium

Over the past three years the Consortium has experienced tremendous growth as demonstrated from the following statistics.

- We started with 4 inter-institutional collaborations and we now have 23 inter-institutional collaborations.
- We started with approximately 80 professional volunteers and we now have over 700 professional volunteers, and
- We had no external partnerships with the Consortium and now have 18 significant regional partnerships!

This growth has benefited from the shared vision of the 21 college presidents and each of the 700+ professional volunteers who believe that our Consortium can make a significant difference in Western New York. Future initiatives include:

- Partnering with the business sector around stronger ties between Consortium members and the sectors we support with our graduates,
- Partnering within the Consortium to effect lasting outcomesbased change that results in improved graduation, time-todegree, and job placement rates, and
- Cultivating stronger strategic leadership within the Consortium that will prepare individuals for increasing responsibilities at their individual institutions.
